EUTOPIA Connected Learning Communities

EUTOPIA Connected Learning Communities (CLC) have the vision to provide an innovative approach to transnational educational collaboration. The CLCs provide the organisational and thematical framework for the interuniversity cooperation and cross-campus learning activities within the alliance, we consider them the spine of EUTOPIA. Teams of teachers, students and other actors in society join forces in a participatory learning and knowledge creating process. CLCs are designed on a value adding principle: their implementation starts by identifying existing curriculum components in the home universities of EUTOPIA and supporting educators that display motivation for expanding their international contacts with colleagues working on related topics in the other universities within the alliance. EUTOPIA's educational model is unique in bringing bottom-up innovation and recognising good practices in active learning throughout the educational cycles (Ba/Ma/ PhD and postgraduate). EUTOPIA is home of 30 communities. They cover a wide range of challenges in today's society such as: European decision making, social change, citizenship, constitutional issues, multilingualism, critical data analysis, artificial intelligence, sustainable geographical systems and many others (see booklet for more details from the three cycles of CLCs). The CLCs connect hundreds of academic staff members and their students across EUTOPIA institutions and provide a new model for sustainable and inclusive transnational collaboration.

This workshop is organised in three parts. Together they are designed to provide participants with hands on opportunities to reflect, engage and discuss the CLC model. In order to foster the development of courses within the framework of the CLCs, the Center for Interdisciplinary Learning and Teaching (ZiLL) will present internal support and funding opportunities for research-oriented as well as digital teaching.
